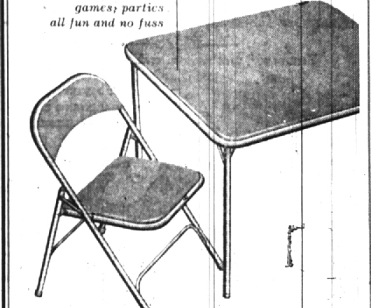

New Light on an Old Subject

Mr. Evans from the Lighting Company gave an interesting talk at the Community Hall last night — on how farmers can cut electric bills. For those who missed it, here's a short recap.

Don't try to light up the subjects in the rafters. Use a reflector and a smaller bulb will probably do the job. Too many farmers use naked bulbs that waste 50% of the light.

Try using movable projector bulbs that beam light the way a searchlight does. A couple of these "spots" will often give you better illumination than a cany of juice-wasting overhead lamps.

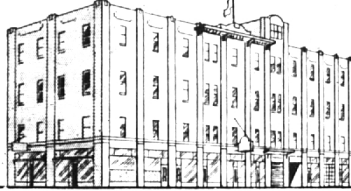
