The Girl Scout camping fund will increase another \$70 when the calendars are all sold.

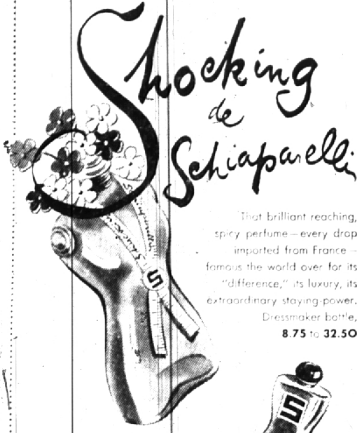
Visiting Parents
