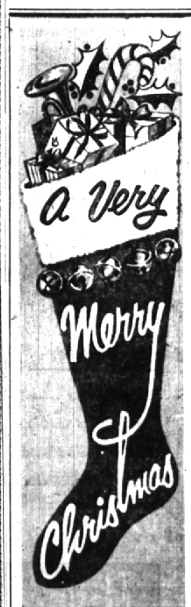

**Commercial College Local Marine Joins Students Featured Landing Exercise**

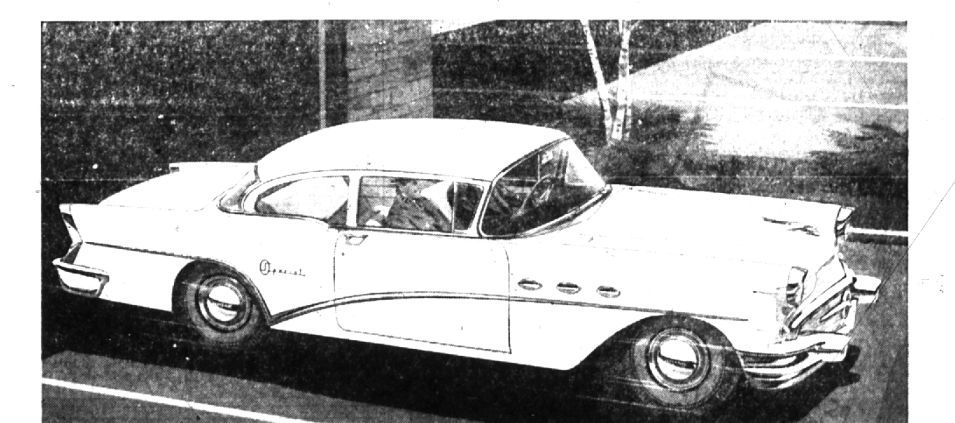
Birmingham students of the Detroit Commercial college party was recently completed as units of the Christmas assembly at the Detroit Women's City club at Kim Park, Oklawaha.
