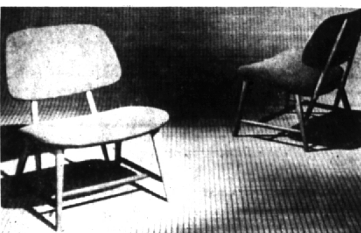
Community Sing Christmas Eve
