Nat'l Guardsman Retires After 35 Years of Service

SOUTHFIELD — Col. Robert D. Cameron, 2883 Northwestern highway, veteran artillery officer and member of State Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, will retire Jan. 1 after more than 35 years of active service.

Colonel Cameron, who in his long career, served in four Michigan National Guard artillery organizations and in four campaigns of the first World War.

RETURNING to the Michigan National Guard in June, 1922, he began his climb up through the commissioned ranks. It was as a lieutenant colonel that he entered federal service for World War II on April 7, 1941 and following overseas service, returned to the United States in Nov. 1945 with two battle stars to his credit. He was promoted to colonel in 1950.

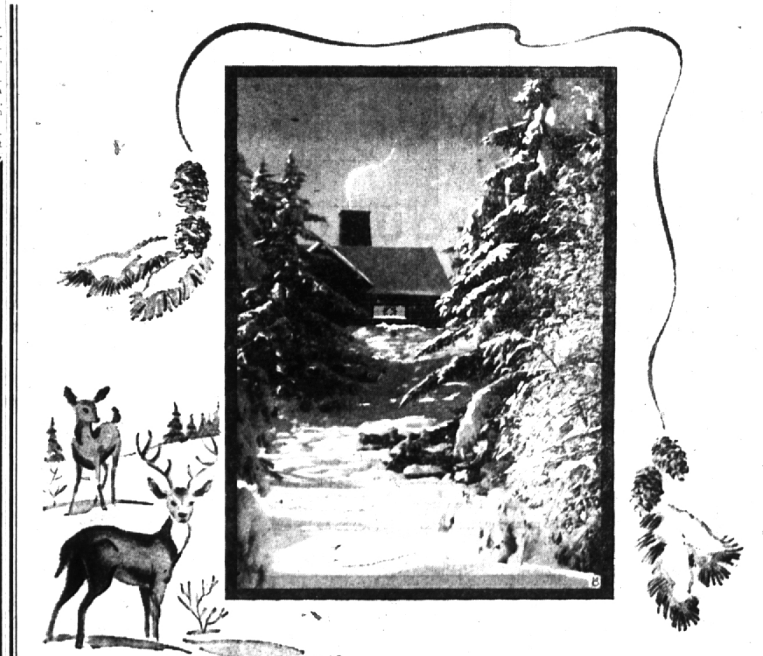
