Lou is a 1941 graduate of Buhl high school and received her BA from Texas Christian university and MA from the University of Michigan.

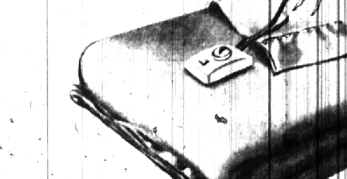
Verlyn was graduated from Western Michigan college with a BA and MA.
