

Offer Prospect Assessor's Job

Birmingham's city assessor post has been offered to one of the three candidates interviewed by city commissioners Saturday morning, according to Asst. City Manager Dana Whitman.

The city expects to hear today or tomorrow whether he will accept the position, Whitman said.

Last week present city Assessor Elmer Haack disclosed he has asked for retirement, effective as soon as possible. Nineteen years Birmingham's assessor, Haack plans a long vacation, then a fee appraisal business of his own.

Court Allows Conversion To 2-Family

City building department has been ordered to issue a permit to enable a single residence at 227 W. Frank to be converted into a two-family structure.

Oakland Circuit Judge Frank Doty, at a rehearing Tuesday, decided in favor of Mrs. Alma Grimes, who contended the city zoning ordinance puts her property as income tax-payer family requirements called for more land than her lot contains.

Judge Doty found Mrs. Grimes had made certain building improvements anticipating two-family use prior to the time the ground area requirements were increased by the city.

Ivan Bound Over To Circuit Court

At his examination before Justice John J. Gaffin in Municipal Court Friday, Paul R. Ivan, 27, of Livonia, was bound over to Oakland County circuit court with bond set at \$5,000.

Charged with gross indecency Oct. 27 and again Nov. 16, Ivan is being held at Oakland county jail. Trial has been set for Dec. 16.

On a motion of the prosecutor, the complaint on which Ivan's second arrest was based has been dismissed.

Office Zone Gets Formal Approval

Birmingham's newest zoning classification, to be known as "Office (Professional)", was adopted this week by city commissioners.

It is intended for use as a buffer zone between residential and retail business areas.

Highly restricted as to setbacks, use of signs, parking, and other aspects, it is expected that several problem spots may get immediate rezoning to the new classification.
