Weeks of preparation have gone into the assembling of creative ideas to be used as model displays for the Christmas Originals Workshop...

MRS. SLAWSON says she would hesitate to make the same arrangement in oval shaped, square, round or a long narrow spray depending on its use.

The beauty of the whole arrangement is that it can be used the same way for table, door or mantel decorations and "do-it-yourself" instructions will be given during the workshop hours.

THE LARGER groupings, which are clusters of ornaments are wired to the frame and the lighter weight or smaller ones, which are individually wired, may be stuck into the moss.

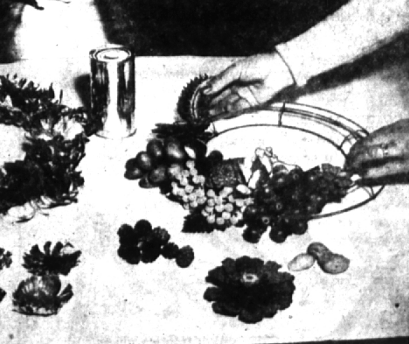

Busy Mother Finds Time To Help Others

Despite the lack of baby sitters and spare time, a busy young Birmingham mother of three pre-schoolers has found a way to devote herself to a worthwhile project outside her home.

Mrs. Arnold Thomson solved her problem by organizing "The Story Book Mothers," 30 young mothers who perform a valuable service for young patients at St. Joseph Mercy hospital.

Story Book Mothers solve the baby sitter shortage by performing their mission evenings, when husbands are at home to stay with children.

WITH HOUSEHOLD duties completed for the day and their own youngsters tucked in bed, the busy women are able to find free time to help at the hospital.

From Sunday through Thursday Story Book Mothers arrive in the children's ward at 8 p.m., when the small patients need attention most.

For 8 p.m. marks the end of cutting hours and the departure of nurses and fathers. It means a difficult time for the children and their mothers, who must prepare the youngsters for bed.

"THE STORY Book Mothers are a real help to the nurses," says children's ward nurse Mary Murphy. "They quiet the children who are restless."
