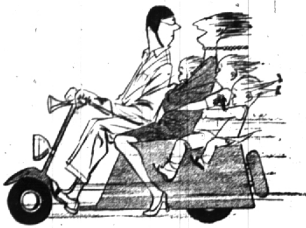


Twilit Room

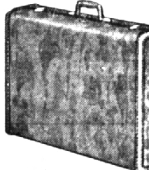

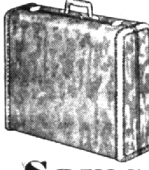
