If You Question Charter Terms, Ask for Its Revision Any proposed charter for a city should receive the unqualified support of most of its voters and taxpayers, if it is to be the constitutional document designed to bring about an orderly and progressive era of progress for a city. That is why, experience proves, the production of a new charter for a community should be designed to meet every present and foresceable future contigency. To formulate a charter that is not in keeping with the reasonable desires and needs of the vast majority of people is seeks to govern, and then to ask the voters to adopt it, is for from statesmanship..., indeed, it is asking for future community dissension and squabbling.
