Mackinac Bridge Building Cited

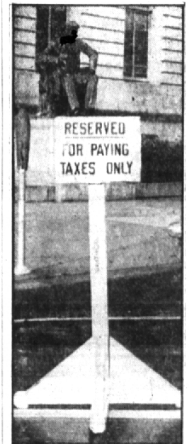
