niques of waging war. The temptation, he points out, will become irresistible to rely upon atomic weapons for security—with the result that eventually no nation will be in a position to wage a major war in any other way.

"One thing seems clear," says the scientist, "Never before has the final outcome of a war been so predictable—there will be no winner even though one may emerge under the assumption he is the victor."

In contrast, Dr. Lapp attempts to ease the public mind a little by painting a glowing picture of the peaceful aspects of atomic energy. In examining the progress made in recent years in medical research and industrial uses for "the new force."

IN HIS MIDDLE 30's, Dr. Lapp was born in Buffalo, N. Y. and is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Chicago. Where he also earned his doctorate in cosmic ray physics. He has been associated in his professional work with Dr. Vannevar Bush and Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer.

In introducing the Birmingham Town Hall speaker will be Dr. Robert Hatt, director of Cranbrook Institute of Science. Following the lecture a celebrity luncheon will be held at Oakland Hills Country club.

National Crime Prevention Week will be observed in Birmingham this year from February 13-19, according to Donald McGaffey, president of the Exchange club. The group is cooperating with the National Exchange club in this eighth annual observance.

A series of programs has been drawn up which will include participation by local dignitaries and law enforcement agencies. McGaffey has announced that Chief of Police Ralph W. Mowley will be general chairman of events next week.

Quoting recently released statistics, McGaffey said, "I'm sure if the citizens of this community know that authorities expect over two million crimes to be committed in the United States this year, over half of which will be by persons under 21, they will be more than willing to join with our program of crime prevention. We have chosen juvenile delinquency to be the target of our 1955 activities, a theme in which every parent should be interested."

"Top level government officials are cooperating with the Exchange club for the nation-wide National Crime Prevention Week to alert the American people to the increasing menace of crime," he concluded.
