Wayne President Next to Speak To Baldwin Unit

Wayne university's president, Dr. Clarence B. Hilberry, is the next scheduled speaker in the series sponsored by Friends of the Baldwin Library. He will present his program in the library auditorium at 8:15 p.m., Feb. 16.

Dr. Hilberry became the university's fourth president in 1953, after serving a year as acting president. He joined the Wayne staff in 1930 as a member of the English department. Nine years later he was named to head that section.

He was appointed dean of administration in 1945, serving there until taking over the presidency.

A NATIVE OF Ohio he holds degrees from Oberlin and the University of Chicago, with an honorary degree from Albion.

Prior to joining Wayne, he taught at Albion and the YMCA college in Chicago. He is co-author of a textbook on the principles of composition.

Dr. Hilberry has been active in the commission on colleges and universities for the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary schools and is now on the commission's planning committee.

Active in civic affairs of Detroit, he is serving on numerous committees and has an active part in several civic and social clubs in the city.
