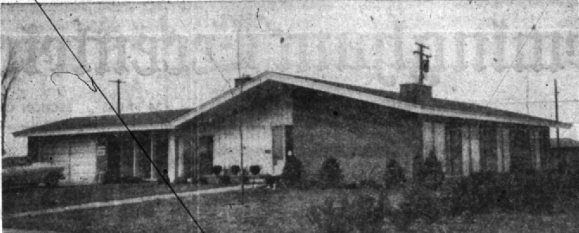

The "1955 Ideal Home," located at Southfield road and Mt. The two-bedroom brick and white siding home will be given to the visitor who guesses closest to the number of nails displayed in a transparent replica of the home. The single-story model was built by Robertson Bros. for the Builders Association of Metropolitan Detroit and furnished by J. L. Hudson. One feature of the home is a recreation room half the width of the basement. Other highlights are the use of sliding, full-length windows and extensive interior brick work.

Further Proposals Asked on Survey

LATHRUP—Action on hiring a private engineering firm to make a study of the city's sewer system was deferred Monday night by the council until two other firms are heard from.

City officials are attempting to find the solution to basement flooding in parts of Lathrup and have agreed to study engineering costs of the survey.

Only bidders for the job at Monday night's meeting were Ayers, Lewis, Norris and May, Detroit, and Arthur Gillespie, Birmingham.

Mayor William H. Harvie instructed City Administrator Leonard Watchowski to get prices also from Pate and Hrs., Detroit, and Ralph A. Main, Birmingham.

A letter from Gillespie suggested that the city's sewers were too small to adequately do the job, adding that disconnection of down spouts from sewers and sewer cleaning would only afford temporary relief.

Truck Bids Tabled

LATHRUP—Seven bids received on a heavy-duty truck for the City of Lathrup Village were referred for further study to Leonard Watchowski, city administrator, by the city council. Low bid of \$4,335.76 was submitted by Hodges Auto Sales, Inc. of Farmdale. A bid will be awarded by the council Monday, Feb. 28.
