Atomic energy is derived is equal to 1300 tons of coal,
Dr. Lapp said.

We are depleting our reserves of coal, burning up our
petroleum and within a century Lapp believes these resources will be gone. Atomic energy can be the source
of power to take their place.

It is low-weight, doesn't use oxygen and is a smokeless fuel. Lapp can envision atomic power plants in
present high-cost power areas, such as Alaska, producing
power cheaply.

"INSTEAD OF SHIPPING them tona and tons of coal, all we woould have to do is air mail them a pound of uranium," Laapp said.

"Look at the enormous appetites for kilowatts our modern home electrical gadgets have," Lapp pointed out. "And every time you turn on the switch, somebody has to burn something to provide the electricity. Atomic energy can produce electricity efficiently and cheaper than we can produce it now."

Atomic energy also can provide extremely precise tools for medical purposes, he said.

LAPP EXPLAINED ATOMIC energy to his audience through what he called the "historical approach" Beginning with "ancient history" when the X-ray was developed in 1895, he proceeded through the "medieval" period of 1932 and on to modern, present-day developments. "The American people simply cannot ignore the split atom," Lapp said, "The matter is too fundamental to be left solely in the hands of officials designated to direct

our atomic program."
