But aside from this coincidence, we find that Washington's mother was "... a notable house-keeper and looked well after the ways of her house-hold. She had some handsome furniture, more silver than was usual in even Virginia homes of

As head of his own home "There were elegancies of many kinds at Mount Vernon, and the General

himself looked after the furnishings of the house. He took advantage of every opportunity to better and increase the household articles at Mt. Vernon.<sup>2</sup> And, as to his interest in silver "... when George Washington was removing to New York to take up his duties as President, he sent his family silver to be melted, with the instructions that it should be remodeled into "The newest and most elegant shapes."  $^{3}$ 

So this leads us to conjecture whether his choice might not have been a forerunner of one of the patterns produced by these famous silver houses.


