## March 7 Hearings On 2 Improvements

At March 7 hearings before the Birmingham city commission, necessity will be determined on two projects involving Webster and Worth streets. The city proposes to place a water main in Worth from Haynes to Webster. Payment of Webster between Adams and Hunter, and of Worth from Webster 300 feet north, also will be on the agenda. After the city manager determines the property owners affected, Birmingham city commissioners this week indicated they would order a sidewalk installed on Woodward north from Ravine road. Recent construction of business in that area requires the walk, say commissioners.

## Tree Planting Tips At Edison Office

Proper tree planting tips, aimed at reducing the amount of maintenance on electrical lines, have been published in booklet form and copies are available at the Detroit Edison office here at 220 E. Merrill. The booklet, "Planting for Permanent Beauty," suggests trees and shrubs that thrive in this climate, when and how they are best planted, and explains the reasons why. Edison officials point out that most of the interruptions of electrical service caused by storms are the direct result of falling trees and limbs.

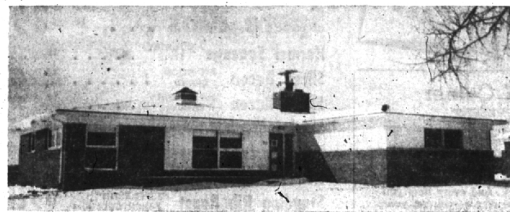
## Appoint Yntema

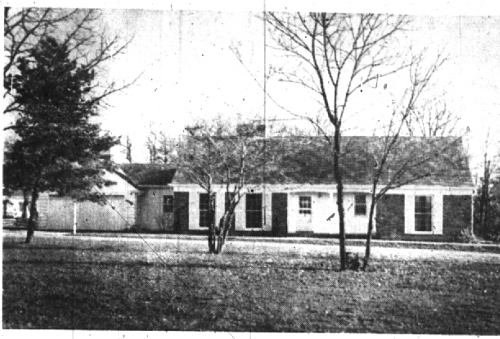

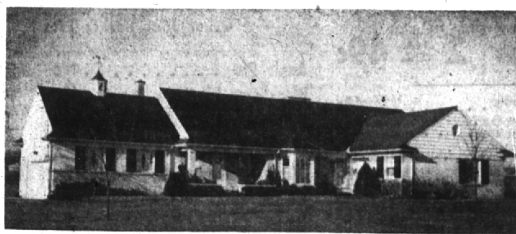
