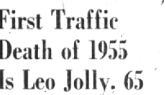

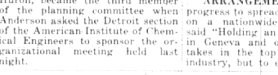
Exchange of Atom Ideas Seen Boon to Industry

The nation's first regional council specifically organized to promote wider exchange of information on peacetime applications of the atom for industry was formed last night at the Engineering Society of Detroit by delegates of more than 35 Detroit area industrial, engineering, scientific and professional societies...

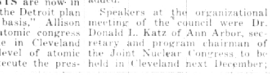
Of nationwide significance, the Detroit atomic council carries President Eisenhower's "atomic engineering of peace" proposal to the working level, for the first time, of both large and small industries, hospitals and research laboratories, according to the announcement. The Detroit atomic council was proposed first by Allison, a member of the nuclear engineering division of the A.I.C.E. Hartwell of Detroit, head of Detroit Edison's atomic power project; and Axel F. Dunham, director of the Atomic Expedition which will be held in conjunction with the Nuclear Congress. Katz is also chairman of the chemical and metallurgical engineering department of the University of Michigan.

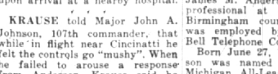

Second Town Hall May Be a Sellout

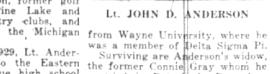
