Dr. Watson received his doctorate from Bobst college in 1915, has studied abroad, is a former member of the faculty of the Art Institute of Chicago and was director of the Milwaukee Art Institute.

He is an author, artist and internationally known tour guide. Since 1936, Dr. Watson has been a membership lecturer of the Chicago Art Institute.

Well qualified for speaking on Spain, Dr. Watson has made 11 trips there to gather material and photograph its color and beauty.
