### Maples Band at Annual Festival

The annual Southeastern Michigan band and orchestra festival will be Saturday at Michigan state normal college in Ypsilanti.

Birmingham will be among 41 towns represented by 73 bands and orchestras.

The festival is divided into six classes for bands, Class AA, A, B, C, D and E. Bands are not placed in classes by ability but according to the enrollment of the school represented.

Class E is easier as far as judging is concerned and consists of bands from small towns. The judging becomes harder and the bands larger as the schools represented are larger.

The Birmingham high school band, entered in class AA for the first time, and young and green this year, will have a harder time of it than usual, competition being keen and judging in AA being harder.

After judging on the required number, "Richard the III Overture" by German, and on the selection, "Ever Ready March" by Goldman and the "Finale from Symphony in E Flat" by Saint Saens, bands will be judged on sightreading.
