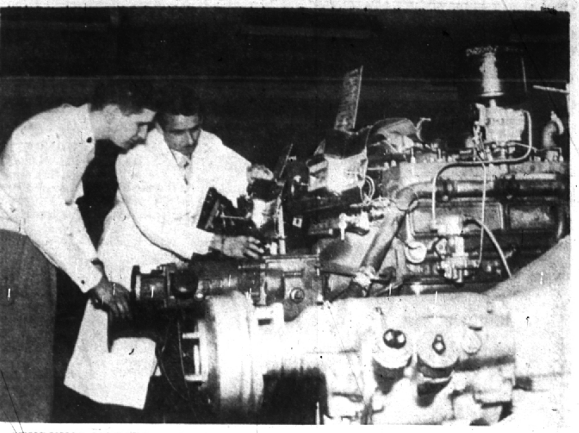

New Police Car Replaces Wreck
SOUTHFIELD — A new police car was scheduled to arrive late yesterday or today for the Southfield police department, to replace the one damaged to extent of \$300 in an accident on Sunday night. Charles Durbin, patrolman in the car parked on West Eight Mile road near Stahlwin when it was struck by the car driven by Alexander Ducan of Detroit, was treated for bruises in Mt. Carmel hospital and released. Ducan paid a \$15 fine and \$15 court costs in Judge Allen Figlie's court in Farmington, after pleading guilty to reckless driving. Chief Phillip Levisne of the township said Ducan was apparently going too fast to stop as he approached the police car, stopped and lit with flares and a dome-light while workers fixed a broken water main.

Object to Servicing Proposed Terraces
It's the same disagreeable confusion—only the location has been changed. This is the Birmingham city commission's off-the-record feeling about its current problem involving the Birmingham school district and a real estate developer. Commissioners Monday night visibly restrained themselves from commenting outspokenly on the city's hesitancy to provide services to a private developer because the school district for the second time apparently had tied a phase of its building program to that of the private land owner. Latest concern is over extension of city services to a proposed 104-unit terrace project on Adams north of Derby. As commissioners have been able to estimate the situation, these terraces are involved with the development by the school board of a new junior high school south of Derby.

Alley Decision May Come Feb. 21
Necessity for an alley to serve three Maple properties and three Martin parcels is planned for decision on Feb. 21 before the Birmingham city commission. Property owners have agreed the alley should not extend through to Bites, but have not determined from whose property the right-of-way would come. H. Seigel & Co. has options on four of the lots involved, where it proposes to erect a branch store.

Attempted Breakin Reported to Police
Birmingham police are seeking a would-be thief who attempted Tuesday night to break into the Boulevard shop, 1955 S. Hunter. A rear door window was broken, police said, and an attempt had been made to force the door.

Lady Was Right About No Water
"That was one time the lady was right," says Chief David Gratoop, referring to one of a dozen calls he received last weekend saying that the Troy township water was off. While most of the calls were traced by the township and the water department to freeze-ups within the homes, one call led to discovery Sunday morning of a water pipe break on Miner street in the township.
