Miss Szanto has long been established in Detroit's musical circles, played by Miss Szanto, Capriol's Suite for Strings (Warlock), To a Wild Rose (MacDowell), and Scherzo from Symphony No. 2 (Schumann).

She was soloist at the debut of the Women's Symphony in 1947, and is making her second appearance now.

In addition to her work here she has had a colorful career in Europe as well as New York and other American cities.

WOMEN'S SYMPHONY is a non-profit organization, sponsored by the Tuesday Musicians with other organizations and individuals who recognize the civic importance of such a group.

Founded in 1947 by the Musicale, the Symphony presented its first concert in May 1948, under the direction of Victor Kroll who still holds that post.

THE 65-PIECE orchestra is financed through the sale of tickets for its two seasonal concerts, and contributions from its sponsors.

The coming concert will include Symphony in G Major (Haydn); Concerto in D Minor (Mozart).
