Col. C. A. Barninger Two Hurt As Car Leaps in Vineyard

A distinguished visitor was entertained at the William Tebo home, 725 Wallace, over the past weekend.

Col. Clarence A. Barninger, a nephew of Mrs. Tebo, stopped here with his family while enroute from Higgins Lake to the NATO Defense College in Paris, France.

The Marine officer has a great deal to look forward to while attempting to forget the past.

For in the past there was a 44-month stretch spent in Japanese prison camps during World War II, an experience that will take years to forget, if ever.

Col. Barninger was captured in the opening days of the war when Japan while he was second in command on Wake Island.

A 1941 ANnapolis graduate, he was assigned to Wake as a lieutenant and shared the nearly four-year-long prison stay with Wake's Marine Commander (C) James Devereaux.

Although he was captured when the island fell to the Japanese in December, 1941, a picture published by Life magazine of a prison camp in September, 1942, was the first indication his family had that he was alive and a prisoner.
