"We have no objection to buying a license and being under supervision by the city, but we certainly believe that complete blacktopping is not necessary. Certainly, the church could put the thousands of dollars involved in that project to better use in religious causes."

Rev. Allwardt said he has not yet received a notice from the city that a license is required, or that the 95-car lot would have to be resurfaced and drains provided within the next two years.

According to the ordinance, which became effective last July but only now is being enforced, the church is required to pay \$5 annually for the privilege of providing off-street parking for parishioners.

"I am certain that all of our members will actively oppose enforcement of such a completely unfair law," the pastor said. "It does not seem at all applicable to church grounds, and should be changed to an indicate."

THE REV. Thomas Kenny, pastor of St. Columban's Catholic church, said his church already has paid the license fee and would comply with the resurfacing requirements if necessary.

"I pointed out, however, that the lot, which holds 100 cars, already is paved to a smooth surface, and that its use is confined to only a few hours a week."

"We don't at all mind resurfacing the lot, if it is required, since we want the church grounds as neat as possible," Rev. Kenny said. "However, we do not believe that there would be any improvement made by putting a new surface on the lot."

"Certainly, the money that will be required would be better used on the construction of our new meeting hall and school."

already has paid the licensing fee. The lot adjoining the church is blacktopped and will not be affected by resurfacing requirements.

According to T. C. Brien, city building inspector, the Presbyterian church also has made application for a license. He said that of the city's 45 lots which required licensing, 33 applications have been received.

There is a total of 22 which must be resurfaced among that group, he said.
