

## Lathrup Village Girl Scout Activities Reported By Neighborhood Chairman

In summing up recent Lathrup Girl Scout activities, neighborhood chairman, Mrs. Frank Fleischer reports all five intermediate Scout Troops have signed up to go troop camping at Camp Narrin.

"For the first time in Lathrup Scout history," Mrs. Fleischer said, "our girls are being offered the opportunity to camp as a troop. To make this possible, seven leaders have taken, or are now taking, a troop camp licensing course.

"This requires a great deal of extra time," she said, "but without specially trained leaders, no troop can go. Troop camping is not conducted as a weekend off, but as a whole troop project, requiring months of careful planning by girls and leaders.

The charitable workings of the Lathrup Woman's club, sponsors of the Girl Scouts are carried still further by the girls. In December, their eighth grade girls of Troop 167, led by Mrs. Walter Heming and Mrs. William Boyd, designed puppets and scenery which they used in presenting a

Christmas play at the Children's home in Pontiac. Children from the Detention home were also brought in for the party.

"It was a real experience in giving for both leaders and girls," Mrs. Fleischer commented.

Other troops made games and collected books to be sent to Korea to children in hospital over there. During December, 45 new Brownie Scouts were inducted into the Lathrup Scout organization and a tea for the mothers was held to celebrate this event.

Mrs. Fleischer reports 544 Girl Scout calendars were sold this year in Lathrup, 10 more than last year.

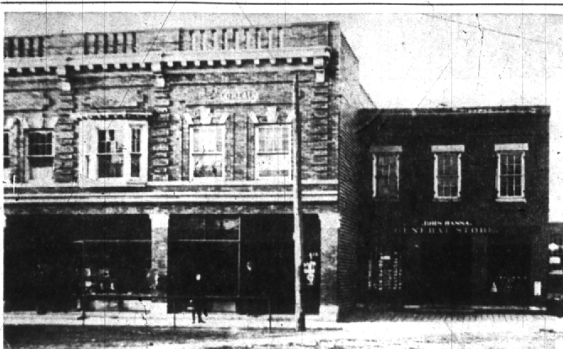
