**Helen Williams Sets June Date**

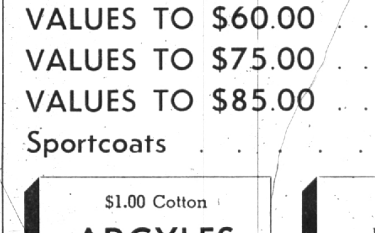

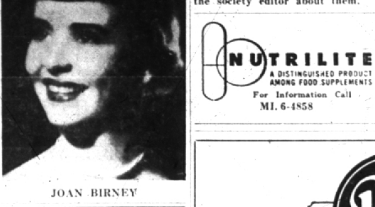
**Family Dinner Reveals April Wedding Plans**

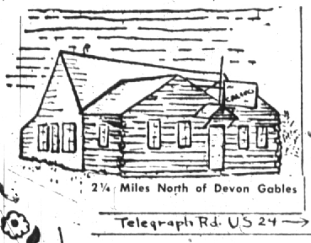

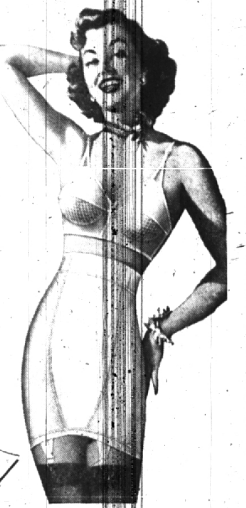
