In the Forest Lake area, construction of six classrooms at the proposed Westview school or at the proposed Callow estates school, depending upon enrollment; and a new junior high school to accommodate 600 to 700 students, to be built in the area west of Lakester and south of Long Lake road.

Construction of two additions of six classrooms each at two of the new schools where need for space is greatest, is contemplated for 1956.

BY 1970 there will be no additional building unless school enrollments exceed present estimates. Another junior high school is planned at this time to handle 600 to 700 students, in the area west of Franklin and south of Long Lake road.

The school district, which in 1945 had 208 pupils, is expecting an enrollment by 1970 of 4,550 students. Enrollment this year was 1,175.

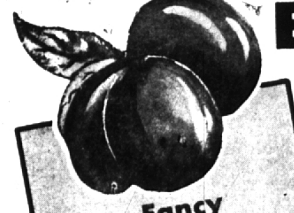
