

Commission Joins In Meeting Tonight
 City commissioners and city planners will join forces tonight to look at current and proposed ways of providing for Birmingham's future development.

First under consideration are the commission and the planning board meet at the city hall will be won to engage as a planning consultant. Goals of the planning board also will be discussed tonight. The board's agenda suggests that "the overall goal should be to further the progress toward realization of more comfortable and pleasant living for all, and the creation of an environment that will promote civic pride."

Commissioners and planners will discuss two proposed parking lots: the southwest quadrant lot just to the south of Sham park, and the northeast quadrant lot on Hamilton, between Ferrelle and Park.

THE SOUTHWEST quadrant lot (the north half of the block bounded by Merrill, Bates, Townsend and Chester) could probably be acquired for about \$5,000, it is estimated. It would provide 22 parking spaces.

The northeast lot north of Hamilton has had detailed arrangements drawn up, and will be considered at the joint meeting.

LL Contributions Short of Goal
 Contributions for Little League Baseball has reached a campaign total of \$310,42, which according to Mrs. Ed Mosher, of the Boys' Club is \$50 short of the \$360 goal.

Trailer Camp Builder Tangles With Troy Twp.

TROY — Township attorneys filed answers in Oakland County circuit court Tuesday to the show cause order brought by Stanley J. Reynolds of Detroit, why the township should arrest him for failure to comply with the township's building laws.

Reynolds was ticketed June 25 for attempting to build a trailer camp at 14 Mile and Stevenson highway without a permit.

Township Clerk Clifton, Truesdell, Building Inspector, William Baker, and Norman R. Barnard, township supervisors, visited Reynolds that day on the site, ordered him to halt the building, and issued two tickets, one for failing to have a permit to build and a second for tearing up an order to stop building.

WHEN REYNOLDS heard their demands to halt construction, he jumped into his car, but was ordered back at gun point by Truesdell, who threatened to shoot Reynolds's car tires, according to Barnard.

When Reynolds failed to appear June 29 in justice court, a warrant was issued by Justice Scott C. Helgeson for his arrest.

It was this order that Circuit Judge Frank L. Doty ordered held up and at the same time he issued an injunction on Reynolds, ordering him to cease building until the court can review the situation.

Barnard and Reynolds was planning action against officials because of the gun incident.

IT IS PRIMARILY a "free play" season but a team game will be organized if enough youngsters want it. Frequently as many as eight different activities go on at the same time.

Children have use of the trampolines and gymnastic equipment. They may play basket ball, ping pong, badminton or roller skate. Billiard, archery and baseball, conducted outdoors near the school, are used to supplement the gym program.

Other activities in the summer recreation program include swimming at Barnum pool, supervised playground activities, golf at Springdale park and a day camp program, also at Springdale.

Over 100 youngsters are learning the fundamentals of golf under Robert Fautsch. On Tuesday and Thursday mornings, children from 12-15 may play the 9 hole course for 25 cents.

Second Major House Fire

Second major fire to a Bloomfield Hills home in less than a month, was believed to have been touched off by poor wiring, according to firemen.

Fire gutted the upstairs of a Robert W. Budd home on Vaughan road Monday night, leaving the lower parts of the home badly damaged by water used to fight the blaze. Budd is president of Great Lakes Cereals and Flour Co.

Firemen were unable to give an estimate of damage to the 15 room home. Unofficial estimates place it near \$100,000.

Domine Vetrano, Bloomfield Hills fire commissioner, directed the operations of department from the Hills, Cranbrook and Bloomfield townships as they fought the fire for almost four hours.

ONE MONTH ago fire ripped through the Otto Kern home on Long Lake road, leaving behind an estimated \$100,000 loss.

The fires were similar in that the upper stories of each were first to be hit by the flames and both families were away on vacation.

Alone in the Budd home was Alberta Keely, a servant, who turned in the alarm.

Much of the furniture in the downstairs and some on the second floor was saved by volunteers.

Water brought from a pond 1500 feet from the house, was processed through a portable canvas tank to fight the flames.
