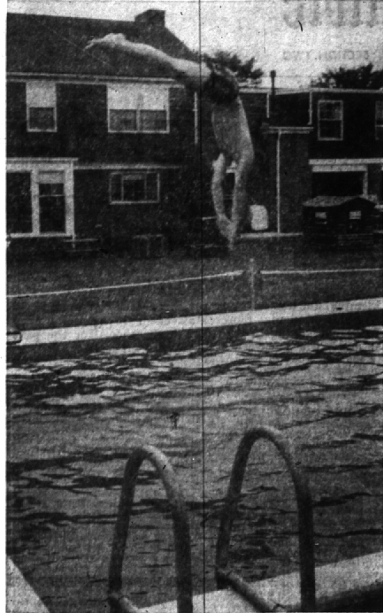


# Neighbors Enjoy Blue Plastic Pool
