Judy Reigns At Campus In Mexico

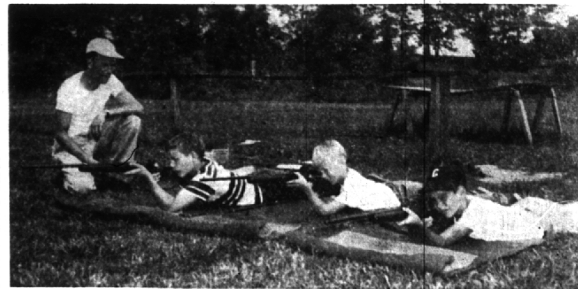

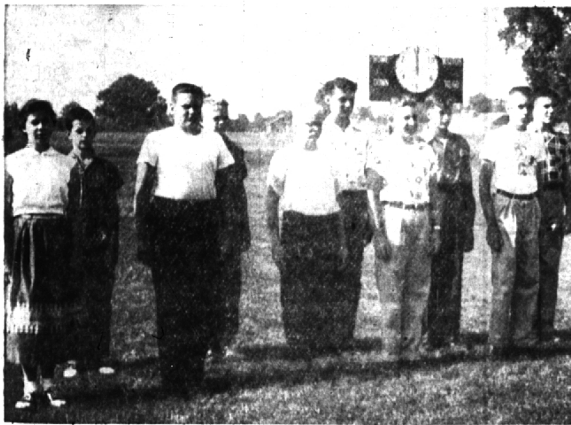
Sure-Fire Fun
