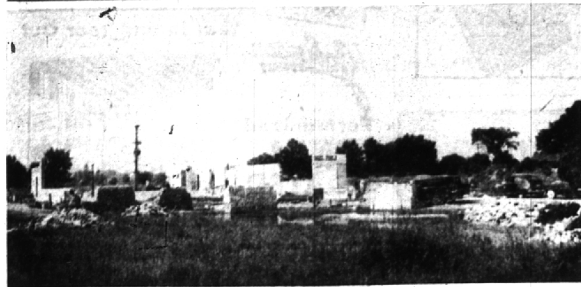

English Bishop Here For Ordination Rites

A Christ Church Cranbrook parishioner will be ordained to the Episcopal priesthood at the 11:15 a.m. service there on July 17.
The Rev. Fred Nicholson, a communicant at the Cranbrook church since 1938, has just completed his three-year course at Virginia seminary, and has been assigned as assistant at Christ Church in Dearborn.
A former resident of Farmington, he was a member of the Christ Church Cranbrook choir prior to entering the ministry.

HE HAD ALSO been supervisor at the Ford Trade school for many years until resigning three years ago to become a clergyman.
The Right Rev. Charles R. Claxton, bishop of Warrington, Lancashire, Eng., will officiate during the ordination ceremonies.
Bishop Claxton had been previously engaged to appear at Cranbrook on that date and was invited to take part in the ancient order of service, "laying on of hands" when Mr. Nicholson became a member of the priesthood.

JULY JUMBLE

Let's be prosaic and perhaps a little boring. The details of perfection are usually a little bit that way.
For those few spots left for color you can still plant GLADIOLUS. (We heard you can get same at half-price from McClellan-Ball Co.) (See Bernie.)
Can't tell you much about San Francisco as we just arrived. However, it is hilly.
Are you coming apart at the seams? It is a humidifying experience. Get some CALCIUM CHLORIDE and MIDWEST DE-HUMIDIFIER and remove from the air the cellar-damp which destroys seams, book bindings, trunks, clothes, et cetera.
Perhaps you forgot—we did announce that our shop is CLOSED ALL DAY WEDNESDAYS DURING JULY & AUGUST
As the firefly said, on emerging from the electric fan, "I am de-lighted". Don't go fumbling around in a dark yard. Get a good firefly or come in and take a gander at our new garden lights.

1. Set of 3 SNACK BASKETS
