TROY — Township board members authorized the purchase of a new police car from Rembrandt Bros. Dodge dealers of Pontiac.

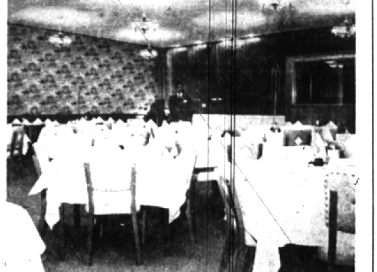
