A Charing Cross road family, Mr. and Mrs. Roland C. Koehler, has "adopted" Adriana Ann Van Driel, a 14-year-old Dutch girl according to an announcement from the Foster Parents' Play for War Children.

Adriana, never a healthy child, was born during Germany's occupation of her homeland. Her father was killed in a 1942 air raid on Germany where he had been taken to serve at compulsory labor.

Today she suffers from an incurable heart ailment which will permanently bar her from any sort of active life.

IN SPITE of this, Foster Parents reports say, she is an eager, bright, intelligent child, getting good marks in her school work. An additional handicap for the girl is serious eye trouble which has already necessitated several operations.

Her hobbies include sewing, embroidery, reading and cooking. She hopes to continue her education so she may qualify for a "sitting down" job and become a useful, self-supporting citizen.
