# Sponsors Needed For JA Firms

Birmingham Junior Achievement firms still need 14 sponsors, according to Avrum Schulzinger, publicity director.

Dodge division of Chrysler corporation and Vickers, Inc. have pledged sponsorship for two junior achievement firms but Schulzinger says that with one sponsor per JA firm, 14 more are needed to operate at capacity and satisfy the demand of Birmingham youth for JA participation.

Birmingham JA plans call for a two-shift operation, which means a potential of sixteen JA firms with as many as 320 boys and girls participating.

SCHULZINGER says that sponsorship costs no money and does not make the sponsor liable for a JA firm's debts. All that is needed are three volumes of advice for from 60 to 80 hours during the school months.

These advisors will be thoroughly trained in the program by JA staff personnel during the summer according to Schulzinger.
