

Probate Procedure In City Lot Sale

Probate procedure will be followed in the sale of part of lots 56, 57 and 58, city-owned property in the Adams Park subdivision. Located immediately south of Webster avenue, the business sites have a combined frontage of 128 1/2 feet on US-10, with a minimum and maximum of 35 and 46 feet depth.
