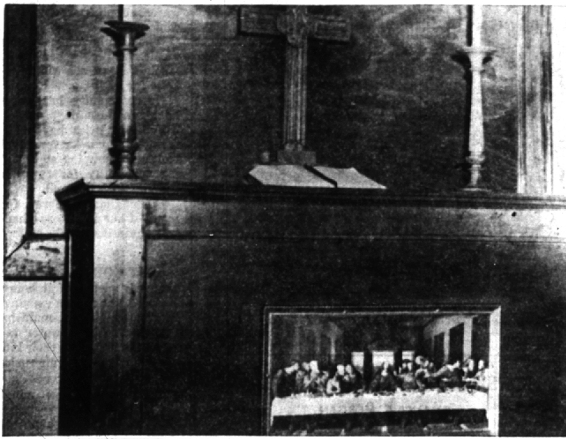
Attend Bible Camp

Church Under Construction

Walter Carey, chairman of the building committee of the Kirk in the Hills, has announced that building has begun on the gothic cathedral sanctuary of the Kirk.
It is estimated that approximately two and a half years will be required to complete the edifice.

The present building contract is for approximately \$1,500,000. When completed, the edifice and the church house will represent an expenditure of about \$4,000,000.
The church, which is the gift of Colonel Edwin S. George, a long-time resident of Bloomfield Hills, was inspired by and is patterned after the ancient Melrose Abbey in Scotland. Its tall, graceful tower will soar 107 feet above the earth.
The church, when completed, will seat 628 worshippers. The pipe organ will have 80 ranks of pipes, which is now being manufactured. The architect in charge of design is Eugene Cleland of the George D. Mason company. The general contractors are the O. W. Burke company.
During the construction of the congregation will continue to worship in the undercroft.
The Rev. Harold C. DeWindt, D.D., is minister of the Kirk.
