

## Wonnberger Fantasy Premier Dates Set

The July 27-28 performance of Cranbrook Summer theater will serve as a premier for Carl G. Wonnberger's poetic fantasy, "The Golden Blackbird," and will present a cast of 55 children from 9 to 14 years.

Seven directors will work on the production with Sara Strenge's supervision. Patricia Philipp has done the choreography and supervised the dancing.

Costumes, running the range from royalty to animal and oinks, have been in charge of Eleanor Falazzi. Annette MacKinnon will do makeup. The entire performance will be coordinated by Annetta Wonnberger, associate director.

THE STORY describes the re-creation of a wicked queen (Elaine Surowitz, Sandra Alper) who, with her confederate (Kathie Backler, Thelma Gossett), and the bear (Jerry Bangs, Penny Fraubel) advice of her witch mother

(Judy Sullivan, Jane Griffith), plans the destruction of her own beautiful daughter (Chris Norvell, Whitney Walker).

Her weak husband (Dick Cavalier, Ronnie Harwith) and her cunning court counselor (Bob Scott, Frank Green), make this possible, so she banishes her daughter to the same valley in which lives the fabulous Golden Blackbird, sought by Prince Darmaime (Jimmy Walker, David Huebner) to save an elderly king (Busty Bunt, Mike Currier).

To get the blackbird the prince has a long journey. He is aided by a leopard (Carol Weston, Betsy Quinn) and a bear (Jerry Bangs, Penny Fraubel), a turtle (Mikie Greer, Pat

Nolan), a hare (Nancy Chapman, Carlyn Vogt), a monkey (Marj Rappaport, Martha Hopkin), a leopard cat (Crist Webb, Caron Bender) and an old lady (Anne Kyes, Mary Ann Affleck).

EVENTUALLY, aided by a court confidante (Karen Dawson, Nancy Walker) and impeded by a group of loreless led by dancers Sharon Snyder and Mary Jane Funke, the prince finds the magic valley . . . and the princess. He is caught as he tries to steal both and is compelled to go out in search of the porcelain princess, which he finds with the help of pixies (Lane Emmer, Betsy Wright, Judy Barnett, Susie Bunt, Ros Surowitz, Diane Stansbery, Anne Hoppin, Halie Stansbery, Sue Ryan, Mary Seibert, Pat Danto, Carolyn Barnett).

The porcelain princess (Lisa Lon, Vicki Shober) has a porcelain mother (Judy Storey, Georgeanne Engelhart), a porcelain father (Jerry Eller), and a lover (Dennis Currier). Eventually the good fairy (Carol Weston, Betsy Quinn) brings all to rights.
