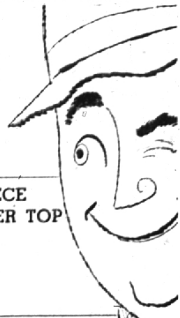

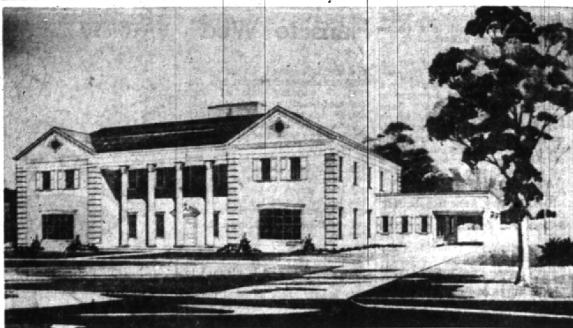
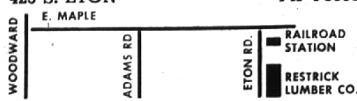

Begin \$250,000 Funeral Home

Ground was broken last week on a new \$250,000 building for the Wm. Vasu Funeral Home at 1475 N. Woodward Avenue, between 13 and 14 Mile roads.

According to William Vasu, president, the new quarter-million dollar funeral home will be one of the most modern and completely equipped in the entire country.

The building will be of Georgian Colonial design and brick construction, and will be completely air conditioned. Two large parking areas will provide ample parking facilities. Architect for the building is Lester H. Davies and general contractor is A. N. Hickson, Inc.

Vasu says that he expects the new home will be ready for serving the residents of Birmingham, Royal Oak, Bloomfield Hills, Beverly Hills, Berkeley, Pontiac and other Oakland county communities by December.

Associated with him as general manager of the new home will be Edward J. Lynch, Jr., who has been with the firm for 10 years.

The 33-year-old firm was founded in 1922 by the late John Vasu, father of the present owner, and has operated continuously since that time. The company now operates a large funeral home at 13308 Woodward, which serves Detroit and vicinity.

A new type of luminous ceiling will be installed to create a more natural lighting effect. There will be nine magic-eye checkout stands for speedy service and 96 feet of frozen food cabinets to allow for a complete line of frozen products.

THE NEW store has been designed to offer modern shopping facilities for increasing population in the Birmingham area. Miss Elizabeth Dooling of Bloomfield Hills, handled the real estate transaction for the new Wrigley market.
