July Wedding Feature Is Swinging Bell Cake

Unique features of a July 10th wedding was the bride's cake in the form of a large wedding bell which swung and turned in its own frame of white, wound with ivy, and a punch bowl of solid ice, lighted, with pink roses and carnations frozen inside.

The impressive double-ring ceremony was in Central Methodist church on Sunday afternoon and united in marriage Ardis VanSoye of Belding and Ronald Phillips. The rites were read by the Rev. H. B. Johnson of the First Congregational church in the presence of 350 relatives and friends.

THE ALTAR and choir-left were decorated with candles, ferns and large fan-shaped arrangements of pink and white gladioli and asters. White satin bows and carlands of ivy draped the altar rail, front of the choir-loft and marked the pews.

The organist was Mrs. Don Brown, who played traditional wedding music and accompanied Gaye Nellie Childs in three songs, "At Dawning," "I Love You Truly" and "The Lord's Prayer."

Parents of Ardis are Mr. and Mrs. Auburn G. VanSoye of Belding, and the groom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Phillips of Hazel street.

THE BRIDE, given in marriage by her father, wore a gown of white French lace over blush pink tulle and lined with white satin. Scallops of the lace formed the yoke at the high neckline, and edged the points of the long sleeves. The front of the sleeve-wide skirt was made with alternating tiers of lace and white tulle, and the chapel-length train was edged with a wide ruffle of the tulle. Her veil of French illusion in blush pink, was caught to a crown of lace over satin and trimmed with sequins and pearls. She wore a gold cross and chain, gift of the groom.

Her flowers were white carnations and signetics in a round arrangement centered with three pink rose-buds, and strands of pearls and ivy forming a frame.

THE attendants were all dressed alike in pastel nylon over taffeta, with fine flower tracings in white. The gowns were trimmed in matching nylon tulle, and they wore small hats of the same tulle with white velvet crowns. Each wore a necklace of white velvet ribbon with a tiny fresh rose-bud at the throat. They carried white carnation bouquets trimmed with white
