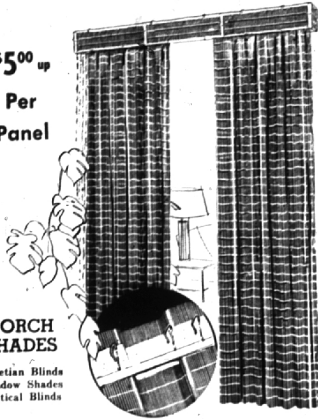

The Daileys are members of the Methodist church of Royal Oak. Their hobbies are fishing and hunting.

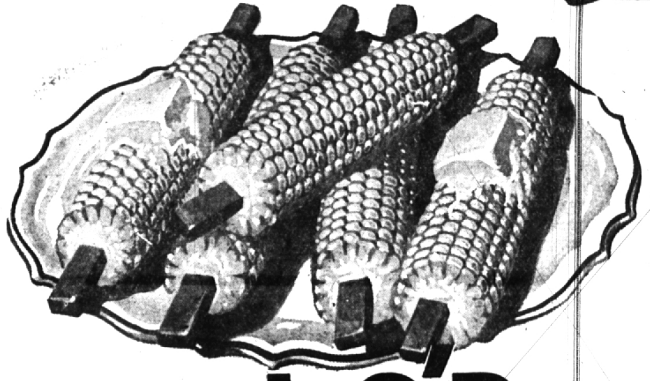
