They had seen higher mountains and more glaciers, we had not seen a combination of valleys, mountains, glaciers, switchbacks, in so restricted an area. The sight was thrilling, and we exposed considerable film, hoping some of it will do justice to the grandeur of this part of Glacier National Park.

WE LEARNED, too, as we drove along, why we couldn't get over Logan Pass three days before; remains of high snowfields, and snow fall, were also the highway, some of it as high as 50 feet. Indeed, driving this highway (as with most mountain roads) is not without increasing danger from snow and rock slides.

The U.S. Dept. of the Interior, which controls our National Parks, maintains crews and equipment to keep the Mt. Cannon road to Logan Pass open to travel during the three-month tourist season.

When we reached the top, or Logan Pass, so much thick cloud was present that all cars turned on their running lights, so Phil and I decided to turn around and go back to the West Glacier.

ON THE WAY up to Logan Pass we came upon a black bear, walking along McDonald Valley road. We stopped at a workman's tourist, to take some pictures. When we came back nearly three hours later the bear was patrolling his "station," hoping for food.

Historians are requested never to feed the bears, for they have been known to injure, even kill, human beings in the past.

Indeed, in today's Montana newspaper there is a story of a black bear that attacked a woman's tent and mangled off with his two-year-old girl baby. Bloodhounds and 250 men took up the chase, but I write this, two days after the tragic event took place, the child has not been found.

ANOTHER STORY in the same paper tells of a 27-year-old hiker who in Glacier Park who was awakened in his sleeping bag at night and mauled by a bear. He lost one ear, part of his scalp, and his forearm was clawed.

My companion, Phil Rich, has been in Alaska and seen a moose bear that all bears will not bother with, but which is likely to give you trouble if you molest her. He says it is a human being, a morsel of bacon grease or some other food that means food to the bear.

At one of the turn-out spots on the road up to Logan Pass we also came upon a yearling cinnamon bear, who had climbed up a very steep rock-strewn mountain side to reach the road. We, and others, took more pictures.

THESE MONTANA folks, as well as most people we have met on this trip, are friendly. Montana calls itself "The Treasure State," because it mines much silver, gold, and copper.

When you purchase something, it offers a five-or-more-dollar bill, you can always expect one or more silver dollars back in change.

Well, enough for this week. From another time we travel toward Seattle and Vancouver. (Hope in my next I can tell you about a nice chat of trout.)
