

### Red Cross Needs Blood Stock For Holiday Needs

Labor Day will be next on the agenda for heavy demands on blood banks throughout the country, and Oakland county will be no exception, according to Red Cross estimates.

Mrs. John Blanchard, 1466 Glenary, said collections at all banks scheduled during the next month must be high if the expected demand is to be met. She pointed out that the holiday traffic at this time is especially heavy due to vacationers returning home ready for the school season, thus increasing the accident rate.

She reported that June saw six mobile units receive 112 pints of blood. Of these 555 were released to Oakland county patients and 63 pints to aid neighboring communities.

The next mobile bank visit for this area will be at the First Methodist church from 2 p. m. Aug. 8.
