He Went on Location

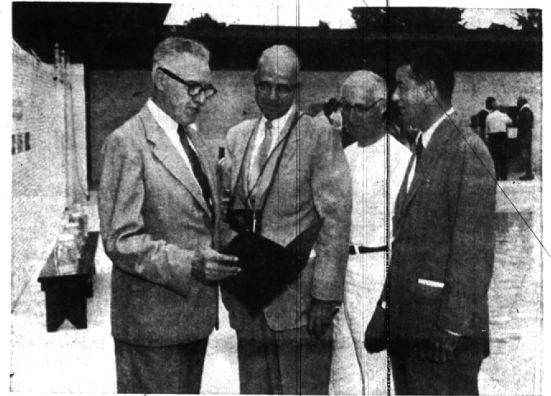
