

Commission Talks of City Organization

SOUTHFIELD On the agenda last night for discussion by charter commissioners were Chapter IV and V of the charter.

Chapter IV deals with governmental organization and Chapter V takes up general provisions regarding officers and personnel of the city.

Qualifications of, and disqualifications of officers both elected and appointed, was discussed at length in Chapter V, as well as office vacancies, resignations, compensation, and bonding of officers.

In Chapter IV, the commission took up the city council, mayor's selection and term of office, compensation, duties of the mayor and administrative offices, as well as specialized boards and committees.

Last week Eugene Swem, commission chairman was asked to write to U. S. Senator Patrick McNamara (D-Mich.) for more information regarding the possibility of a post office for the new city.

ATTORNEYS Julius L. Berns was engaged by the commission to render necessary legal services in connection with the charter at a fee of \$2,500.

Berns outlines a possible procedure for the city budget, with preparation by city manager and examination approval by the council, public hearing and final confirmation.

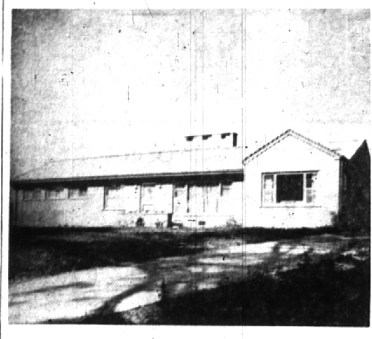

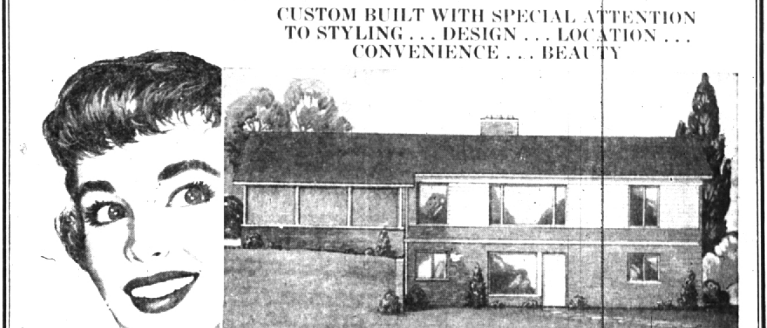
