Spend Five Weeks In South America

Former students of Dr. Robert F. Ziegler who are now practicing in South America sent the doctor and his wife home to Beach road from their recent five-week flying tour laden with native dolls for their three-year-old daughter, Sally.

Dr. Ziegler, physician in charge of the Division of Pediatric Cardiology at the University of Puerto Rico, and Mrs. Ziegler, who is with Ford of Puerto Rico as surgeon in charge of Ziegler's combined business with thoracic surgery. While Dr. Ziegler was in Puerto Rico, he lectured and gave patients at the request of the South American trip.

Accompanying the Zieglers were doctors, Dr. Lam performed a num-

LEAVING Miami, where they spent a day, the foursome flew flying on to Santiago, Chile. At Santiago they landed in the midst of the student revolution. "We were quite safe," Mrs. Ziegler said, "but it was all very exciting."

After a week in Buenos Aires they flew to Salta, Argentina, where they encountered the revolt against the Peron government.

At their next stopover in Puerto Rico, the Zieglers visited with Mrs. Ziegler's brother, Lt. Charles Eberle, and his family. Lt. Eberle is stationed in Puerto Rico with the U. S. Air Force, and it has been more than three years since they have been able to get together.

"IT WAS a wonderful experience to meet the charming, hospitable South Americans and to learn their customs," Mrs. Ziegler said. "Although it was hard to leave them behind, the most wonderful part of our trip seemed to be our return to the United States. It brought us a greater appreciation of our way of life, our abundance of good food and water, and a keener awareness of our four freedoms."

Dr. Ziegler has been invited to return to the same South American cities next year for a more intensive lecture series.

At present, Dr. Ziegler is working on a forthcoming book, a companion volume to his "Electrocardiographic Studies in Normal Infants and Children," which is widely used in the medical field.
