PFC William E. Foust, 24, recently graduated from the army's 25th Infantry Division Unit Supply school in Hawaii.

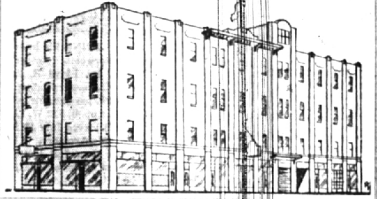
Foust, son of Dr. and Mrs. Earl Foust, 28145 Lathrup, entered the army in March.
