Looking forward to making fall college expenses Larry Hedlund, another Southfield high grad has a summer job at Western Electric working in the carpentry and machine shops.

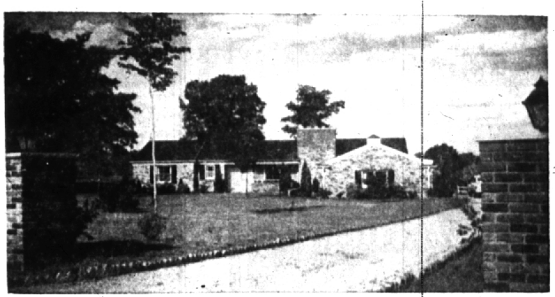

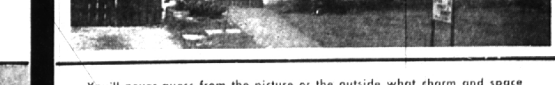
