SWIMMING:
At the Barham School Pool, Season June 20 to Aug. 15. Classes for non-swimmers Boys, 12:45 to 2:15 Girls, 1:15 to 2:45 Boys, 2:45 to 3:15 Girls, 3:15 to 3:45. Non-swimmers must be able to keep afloat above the 47 inch water level. Classes are progressive and children are placed according to ability. Boys bring soap, towel, tennis and 15 cents for each swim. Girls bring soap, towel, suit, cap and 15 cents for each swim. Expert instruction given with free playtime for participants. Pool is open Mondays through Fridays inclusive. No registration necessary.

RADIO DRAMATICS:
At Birmingham high school for teenagers, children only. Radio dramatizations produced and performed for local radio stations. Expert instruction provided for all phases of broadcasting. Registration and \$2.00 fee necessary for participation. Season opens June 27th and closes August 15th.

BASEBALL:
At Sprinkade (11) local baseball diamonds. Diamond facilities provided for free play on mornings and afternoons and organized league play during evenings by the "Little League" ("Babe Ruth" league, and "American League"). Fee: Registration necessary for league play with league affiliation.

JUNIOR SPORTS PROGRAM:
At Birmingham high school gymnasium. Boys and girls 10th grade and above. Weekday mornings 9 a.m. to 12 Noon. Centered activities conducted in supervised groups: basketball, badminton, table tennis, archery, roller skating, volleyball, letter tennis, trampolining, gymnastics, etc. Gym shoes necessary but no fee or registration. Instruction provided for organization and fundamentals. All equipment furnished.

GOLF:
At Sprinkade park. Tentative program, boys and girls 8 years to 18 years. Monday and Thursday mornings before 1:30 p.m. Special rates 25 cents. Free golf lessons and equipment. Expert instruction. Monday later at Sprinkade. This program is available only to those who have had previous experience.

PLAYGROUNDS:
Boys and girls 6 years and older. Supervised activity in elementary school playgrounds. Birmingham, Adams, Terry schools and Pennington. Free play on Saturdays. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday only. Group limited to about 25 boys for each school. No registration or fee required. Craft materials left at Sprinkade. Registration June 20 to August 15th. Children under 8 years of age will not be supervised.

MUSIC:
At Baldwin school for boys and girls interested in an instrumental music program. Expert instruction given all non-players who can read directions and all others. Registration and \$2.00 fee necessary for the summer course.

TENNIS:
At Elm Park. Supervision and instruction available for children on weekday mornings. Individuals supply own equipment. Tennis shoes necessary. No fee or registration required. Special tournaments arranged during the season from June 20 through July 25 and children should be 8 years or older unless they have had previous experience.

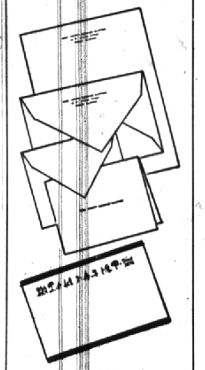
DAY CAMP:
At Sprinkade park. For boys and girls 8 years and older. Weekdays 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Outdoor activities, woodcraft, games, golf, tennis court, cook-outs, crafts. Indoor program of crafts and table games if weather is bad. Staff and children take interest centered programs together. Free for craft materials only. Children must bring own lunch and provide own camp bed. Daily registration at the camp headquarters cabin necessary. Camp limited to 25 individuals each day. June 20 to August 5th.

Rec Activities Start July 5 In Southfield

The annual summer recreation program of Southfield schools will begin July 5 under the direction of Robert Hall, recreation director. Extending six weeks each summer, the program offers activities at Kensington Park for all ages of youngsters.

BUSES will leave Southfield at 9:30 a.m. daily and arrive at Kensington park at 10:30 a.m. The return trip will start at 3:15 p.m. and arrive in Southfield at 4:30 daily.

Activities at the park are under supervision of qualified teachers, and the entire program costs an individual 50 cents per week with a \$1.00 limit per family.

AMONG EVENTS of the program are swimming lessons, handicraft classes such as weaving, leather work, braiding and etching, hikes and community sings and sports activities as baseball, football, croquet and others.

Because of the large number participating, Southfield has been broken in two sections with Lusher road as the dividing line. Buses will pick up those residents East of Lusher on July 5, and those West of Lusher on July 6, and continue in this alternating manner for the six weeks. Pickup locations can be obtained by calling the high school.
