

Summer Theater Alters Schedule To Meet Demand

With a few major changes to accommodate the growing demand for part-time summer training in Michigan's professional school of the theater, Will-O-Way Apprentice Theater is ready for the 1955 summer course.

Registration for the program, scheduled to run June 21-Aug. 9,

opened on June 11. Classes for children over seven, as well as for adults are planned.

The main change is made in class schedule, which, in the past have included only 10 adults who were required to attend all day, six days a week. This summer term

both junior and senior groups will be required to attend only two class hours per week.

The theater offers complete background and training in both acting and production techniques. All forms of expression are included, along with history of drama, theater terminology, stage manage-

ment, lighting, makeup, radio and television, and other phases.

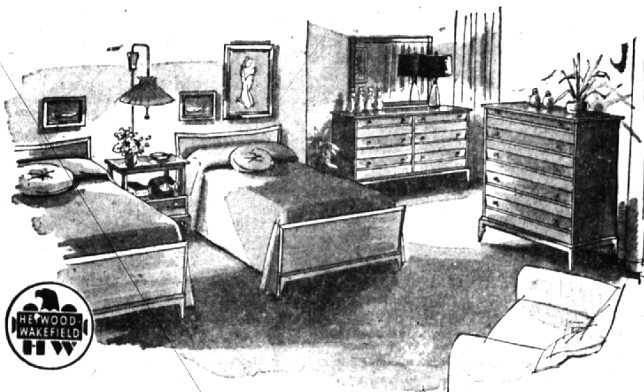

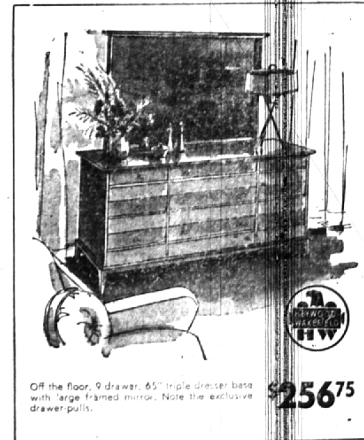
