

### Uncertain Vaccine Supplies Delay Clinic Schedules

Fifty vaccine clinics for the Birmingham school district are discontinued until further notice, Mrs. Howard Kieman, area clinic chairman, said Tuesday.

"They will be held on almost a moment's notice," she said. "All we can do now is tell parents to listen to their radios and keep a constant check on daily papers.

"The clinics will be held as quickly as possible after a sufficient vaccine supply is received. We do know, however, that those scheduled for June 4, are cancelled."

flects a forthcoming additional expenditure of almost \$12,000 for defenses against the destructive Dutch elm beetle.

The Baldwin public library would get a \$4,000 increase next year, city plan board \$3,300 more, and recreation board \$1,000 more.

THE RECREATION budget is going to get additional support from commissioners Saturday at a committee session.

For the first time, civil defense activities will come into an appropriate budget. Last year it was only \$500. Egbert proposes to raise it to \$6,000 next year.

Largest cuts applied to the budget are shown in the city's road-soling commitments, down \$15,000 from last year, and fire department equipment down \$37,500.

Total special appropriations are down \$63,000.

To retain this freedom is still a problem for there are many in and out of government who would, if they could, try to control what newspapers, magazines, and book publishers produce.

"Therefore, Dr. Hannah, it is to be hoped that when you get up your modernized communications media department in this University you and your colleagues join with those informed men and women who know that only a free press will continue to remain the best ally and defender of our Constitutional rights."

"ONLY A free press can speak out for or against one or more evils in government... for it must be remembered that neither television nor radio is completely free to criticize government, since both must obtain their licenses to operate from government itself."

"This is not to say that television and radio people want to be supine and subservient to government and its variety of bureaucrats. It is to say that any communications media that is required to get permission to operate from government is going to have to be partly shackled."

"There are two basic reasons for this:

FIRST, granting a wave length to a television or radio station by its very nature excludes others from that wave length. This in effect gives a station a monopoly, and where monopoly exists in our country, governmental regulation also is required.

Second, it won't be good practice to criticize the governmental agency that lets you operate.

"But the printing press, of course, is not dependent upon the whims and caprices of governmental officials for a license to print. This right is given to anybody who wants to engage in it."

"THEREFORE, it seems to many of us, that a free and unshackled press is democracy's best defender. We in the newspaper business, who are informed about mankind's long struggle to have a free press, strongly urge, Dr. Hannah, that in building your plan of a communications media center at Michigan State University you make journalism a goodly portion of the foundation stone."

With his usual good-natured smile, Dr. Hannah responded: "You have a strong point there, girl you mentioned it."
